



I write this letter to express my sincere appreciation to the Miami Valley Association of Physicians of Indian Origin (MVAPI) for the recent \$10,000 contribution made by Dr. Soma Avva on behalf of MVAPI. Because of your gracious contribution, the Omega Community Development Corporation (Omega CDC) will be able to sponsor field trip experiences for students attending our Scholars of H.O.P.E. after school programs.

For the past five years, the Omega CDC Scholars of H.O.P.E. (Healthy, Optimistic, Prepared, Educated.) program has provided after school learning at Fairview PreK-6 School and E.J. Brown Middle School.

Both Fairview PreK-6 School and E.J. Brown Middle School are in the Northwest Dayton community. The schools' enrollment is predominantly Black or African American with 100% of the students eligible for free or reduced lunch. During the academic year prior to the pandemic (2018-2019), the majority of the students in both schools scored below proficient in math and reading.

The needs are great for our scholars and the Covid-19 pandemic has certainly exacerbated the challenges in their homes and schools. Thankfully, Omega CDC's Out of School Time programs are designed to meet students' academic and social needs by increasing the amount of learning and enrichment opportunities and fostering a safer after school environment. Additionally, the programs prioritize engaging families, parents, and caregivers through regular and frequent communication and events, and referrals to other Omega CDC programs aimed to meet basic needs.

During the 2021-2022 academic year, the Scholars of H.O.P.E. programs will serve 150 scholars between both schools. Programs focus on increasing and strengthening student's reading and math skills. Scholars of H.O.P.E. also emphasizes social and





How the *Miami Valley Hospital Foundation* Is Helping

We know you share our concerns about the biggest challenge Miami Valley Hospital has ever faced. The following is a brief summary of some of the fundraising efforts by the MVH Foundation in recent weeks.

High Volume COVID 19 Test Instrument

Premier Health has been able to purchase two types of high speed testers, which will supply 850 COVID 19 lab tests per day to support Premier's needs. This will optimize operational efficiencies in the hospital setting by facilitating effective patient management and by enabling prompt initiation of infection control measures.

Plasma Donation

Premier Health has partnered with the Community Blood Center to offer the COVID-19 Convalescent Plasma Program. The Miami Valley Hospital Foundation is playing an important role in covering the costs associated with lab test necessary for this plasma donation program.
